Riverview Relay for Life 2025 – Celebrating 25 Years in Our Community

In 2025 we will be celebrating our 25th Riverview Relay for Life. Can you even believe it?!

The Relay For Life movement began in May 1985, when Dr. Gordon “Gordy” Klatt walked and ran for 24 hours straight around a track in Tacoma, Washington to raise money to help the American Cancer Society with the nation’s biggest health concern: cancer.

Twenty-five years ago, Jim and Judy Schwartz introduced our community to Relay for Life.

This is what Judy said about Relay for Life. *“I am very excited about Riverview’s first annual Relay for Life. When I heard about this event, I knew the communities of Oakmont and Verona would embrace this experience. I am proud to be associated with Relay for Life for several reasons. First of all, it raises money for a cause which affects all of us one way or another. We have all been affected either by our family members, friends, colleagues, or ourselves. I am also excited to be able to celebrate the people who are survivors of cancer. Lastly, if you know me you know I love to have fun, I strive to foster cooperation and like to be surrounded by positive people. The event embodies all these elements.”*

Twenty-five years later, we are still raising money to fund the mission, celebrating our survivors and honoring those we’ve lost, and coming together as a community for a good cause. As we celebrate our upcoming 25th anniversary, we are also looking forward to surpassing over two million raised since the event first began here in Oakmont. Cumulatively, the Relay For Life of Riverview has raised \$1,973,031.69 towards the fight against cancer!

Verona Volunteer Fire Company

**Message to Businesses and Residents
 Regarding Emergency Entry**

The Verona Volunteer Fire Company is an emergency response agency that utilizes the Knox Box system. A Knox Box is a lock box mounted on the outside of a structure that allows a business or residence to have a key locked on the outside of their property that would give the Fire Department access in the event of an emergency, eliminating the need for forcible entry, while still protecting the security of the building.

Knox Box uses a secure key unique to each municipality that uses the devices, meaning we have one key that will open any Knox Box that is installed anywhere within the borough limits of Verona.

For a business, in the event of a fire alarm or emergency, this allows the fire department quick access inside the building if nobody is there, to quickly address any alarm or issue inside without waiting for a keyholder. There are two options for boxes that allow for just one key, or an entry key for access inside the building plus additional interior keys and information such as alarm codes, floor plans, contact information, etc.

For residential homes, there are options available for entry like businesses, but on a slightly smaller scale. The benefit is the same. It allows for entry into the home in the event of an emergency, whether you are home or not. A lot of residential customers utilize this device for themselves or a loved one that may be elderly or with a physical disability that wants peace of mind that a first responder will be able to get to them.

Regardless of the need, this is a tool that can help save life and/or property, and we support. For information regarding this system, you can visit www.knoxbox.com, enter the state and municipality (Verona), and the options will be displayed for your needs. The Verona Volunteer Fire Company is also available to talk to and guide businesses and residents, if they are interested, on how to obtain this safety tool. VIETNAM ERA VETERANS BAND TOGETHER TO UNDERTAKE A RESTORATION AND PRESERVATION PROJECT

The Verona-Oakmont Vietnam veterans' group, including Harry Pavone, Denny Schaal, Tim McKee, Mike Gentile, Jimmy DeLellis, Denny Bonaroti, Reno Graham, and John "JB" Schaal, generously volunteered their time to rehabilitate the historic cannon at the Veterans Memorial in Verona. This 105-mm WWI cannon, built in 1917, underwent a significant restoration process. With five grinders running simultaneously, the preparation proved more labor-intensive than the painting itself, taking a total of 70 man-

hours. These dedicated men, all in their mid-70s, worked tirelessly to bring the cannon back to life. The restored cannon is now painted battleship gray, and the wheels were finished with linseed oil. The materials for this project, including paint and supplies, were kindly donated by Avalotis Painting and the Borough of Verona.

This community-driven project highlights the enduring spirit and commitment of these veterans in preserving history and honoring those who served.

Red Light Therapy To Reduce Glucose Levels

The US Centers for Disease Control estimates that 37.3 million Americans or 11.3% of the population have diabetes, which means the body does not produce enough insulin causing too much blood glucose (sugar) to stay in the blood stream. Over time, diabetes can cause serious health problems, such as heart disease, vision loss, and kidney disease.

Researchers from the University of London conducted a study of the effects of red-light therapy on blood sugar levels. In the study, 15 participants received

670 nanometers of red light onto approximately 800 square centimeters of their exposed back for 15 minutes. The 15-person control group had the same equipment placed on their backs, but the light was not turned on.

The result was a significant reduction in blood sugar levels in the group exposed to red light following a glucose intake by the participants. Over a two-hour period, following the therapy, maximum glucose spiking was reduced by 5.1%. Red light exposure can be used to reduce blood

glucose spikes following meals as a safe non-invasive treatment for diabetes management at home.
